Jio Seeks Forensic Audit Report of Rel Infratel

Some lenders marked tower co's accounts as fraudulent after Jio's resolution plan was approved; telco wants to know why it was not disclosed earlier

Mumbai | New Delhi: Reliance Jio Infratel has moved the bankruptcy court, seeking disclosure of forensic audit report of Reliance Infratel after some lenders marked the accounts of Reliance Communications tower unit along with those of its parent — "fraudulent" soon after Jio's resolution plan was approved.

"We want a copy of the forensic audit report disclosed to us so that we can make an assessment of how it will impact the resolution plan," senior counsel Vikram Nankani, representing Jio, said at a virtual hearing on Thursday.

The Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) has directed the telco to furnish a forensic audit report of Reliance Infratel after some lenders marked the accounts of Reliance Communications tower unit along with those of its parent — "fraudulent" soon after Jio's resolution plan was approved.

The NCLT had on December 3 approved Jio's resolution plan to pick up the tower and fibre assets of RCom for under ₹4,000 crore. A few weeks later, State Bank of India, the largest lender to RCom, and other lenders marked accounts of RCom and its unit Reliance Telecom and Reliance Infratel as fraudulent.

The allegations came a year after a forensic audit unearthed questionable transactions worth ₹5,500 crore in the three Andhra-based Reliance Group entities. The probe, which looked at transactions between May 2017 and March 2018, found three large entities buried under hundreds of thousands of others that the SBI led lenders' group suspects could conceal fund diversion.

Jio has sought the audit details from Reliance Infratel's CoC including SBI,

Reliance Infratel, which holds 43,000 towers and 1,70,000 km of fibre, and Reliance Telecom, which mainly houses fibre, are the two units of RCom that went into liquidation with their parent company. RCom's insolvency process is stuck amidst separate legal tussles between asset reconstruction firm IVACIL and Reserve Bank of India, and another one with the telco's department. At the time of fibre for bankruptcy, RCom had debt of ₹6,000 crore, with its financial creditors — including local and foreign banks, non-banking financial companies and funds — laying claims. RCom was forced to shut its wireless operations late 2017, hurt by mounting debt and widening losses amid intense competition in the telecom sector after Jio's entry in September 2016. RCom tried to sell its wireless assets such as spectrum and towers to Jio but failed due to slow legal cases.

Don't Cut Power Supply to Sterling Biotech: NCLT to Gujarat Discom

Mumbai: The bankruptcy court on Thursday directed a power distribution company (Discom) in Gujarat not to take any coercive action against Sterling Biotech under its power.

Sterling Biotech, promoted by Chetan and Nish Sandeera, is under liquidation and owes more than ₹8,100 crore to lenders.

Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) with a plea to restrain Mediya Gujarat VJ Company (MGVCL) from disconnecting power supply since its lenders are trying to sell the company as a going concern.

"The disconnection notice was sent by the electricity department. We are paying our bills regularly but now MGVCL is seeking extra cost for enforcement of its infrastructure," said Sandeep Bajaj, an advocate for the liquidator. The company is facing li-

quidation but still it is a going concern and hence we are seeking the tribunal's intervention to restrain the electricity company from taking any coercive action."

The NCLT division bench of judicial member Janab Mohammed Ajmal and technical member V. Sathyanapathy directed MGVCL to file its response and adjourned the case to June 10. Sterling Biotech was admitted for liquidation on May 8, 2019.

Promoters Chetan and Nish Sandeera have fled India and are believed to be in Africa. The Central Bureau of Investigation, Enforcement Directorate and the Income tax department are looking into the dealings of the promoters. Last year in June, the Enforcement Directorate had attached properties of over ₹9,700 crore owned by Sandeeras.

The group, including subsidiaries Sterling SEZ and Sterling International, collectively owes ₹15,000 crore financial and operational creditors.

OTTs and Digital News Platforms Get 15 Days to Comply with New Rules

News broadcasters' body calls for digital arms of traditional news media to be exempted

New Delhi | Mumbai: The Centre has given 15 days to video streaming services, such as Netflix and Amazon Prime Video, and digital news platforms to comply with the new rules for the sector that came into effect on Wednesday.

Three months after they were notified, the I&B ministry on Thursday asked digital players to respond within 15 days with specific information on their board of directors, content heads or news editors, details of archive repositories offices in India and the self-regulatory body that they are part of.

The News Broadcasters Association (NBA) has requested the government to "exempt and exclude" the traditional TV news media and its extended presence on the digital platforms from the ambit of the IT Rules 2021. The NBA said in a press release on Thursday that the sector has "sought safeguards" and is "sufficiently regulated" by various statutes, laws, guidelines and codes, regulations and judgments.

On February 25, the Centre had brought in new norms under the IT (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021, according to which social media companies, streaming platforms — particularly known as over-the-top (OTT) services — and digital news publishers were put under a three-tier regulatory regime with government oversight. Experts have warned that the rules can have far-reaching consequences on free speech and creativity.

In its public notice, the I&B ministry has listed a format

in which traditional media with a digital presence, video streaming platforms and fully digital news sites will have to furnish details. The ministry said that since notifying the rules, it has "established a communication" with many digital media publishers and their associations. It added that around 100 publishers and their associations have already initiated the process of forming self-regulatory bodies.

While OTT platforms have been specifically asked to send details about content managers, digital news sites have been told to submit information about news editors.

Legal Tangles may Delay Choksi's Deportation

Mumbai | New Delhi: Fugitive diamond trader Mehul Choksi's deportation could take time owing to legal tangles, some sources in Indian agencies told ET.

This came after the Caribbean island nation of Antigua said it would repatriate Choksi to Antigua, after he was expected to be deported to Dominican police while allegedly trying to flee to Cuba in a boat. Choksi had gone missing from Antigua on Sunday. Choksi and nephew Nirav Modi — now incarcerated in London — are wanted in the alleged ₹1,500-crore Punjab National Bank fraud case in India. "Choksi... has been detained by

law enforcement for illegal entry into Dominican. A red alert has also been issued by Interpol bearing Choksi's name." Dominica's ministry of national security and home affairs said in a statement on Thursday. The ministry said it was in touch with the authorities of Antigua and Barbuda to ascertain some facts, including the status of Choksi's Antiguan citizenship. "Once the information is provided by the Antigua authorities, possible arrangements will be made for Mr Mehul Choksi to be repatriated to Antigua," it said. Pratibha@pnt.com

Hirmandani Eyes \$300M from Stake Sale in H-Energy

May sell at least 33% holding; deal to value company at \$1 billion

Mumbai: The Hirmandani Group is looking to raise as much as \$300 million (₹2,100 crore) by diluting a significant minority stake in its energy unit H-Energy, valuing the company at about \$1 billion.

The Mumbai-based real estate developer is approaching private equity firms, sovereign wealth funds and pension money managers for a potential sale of at least 33% in H-Energy, aware aware of the plans said.

UBS has been hired to find a partner. The formal share-sale process is expected to start by mid-June. The funds raised will be used to pay debt and finance ongoing projects, one person said.

H-Energy is developing liquefied natural gas reexportation terminals and cross-country pipelines on India's west and east coasts. The company also offers natural gas solutions including LNG sourcing, reexportation facilities and downstream deliveries, according to its website.

"We had received interest in partnership with H-Energy from many global players for our team to be able to manage. UBS is involved in manage these conversations," a company spokesperson said. "We are actively engaged with many of them."

Set up in 2006, H-Energy is led by Darshan Hirmandani, the son of property tycoon Niranjan Hirmandani. The company is commissioning India's first floating storage and regasification unit (FSRU) based LNG terminal project, Jalgaon Port in Ratnagiri, Maharashtra.

IT Services Cos to Grow at 15% in FY22: HDFC Securities

Pune: Indian IT services companies are expected to grow at a faster pace this fiscal year as companies across the world continue to up their investments in digital transformation projects, HDFC Securities said in a report.

"The pandemic has not just accelerated digitalisation but has also significantly sharpened the operational engine... Key loss indicators remain in strong with a recovery in consulting and slight improvement in deal market share," Anurag Prasad, Amit Chandra and Vishal Vaid of HDFC Securities said in the report.

Most services companies grew about 10% on average in the previous fiscal. They are predicted to grow at a compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) of 15% in FY22 as revenue growth accelerates at a similar pace, the report said.

Even though most companies have implemented salary hikes and will be rolling them out again in a few months, this isn't expected to have an impact on margins as it will be offset by gains through higher off-shoring and better utilization rates.

The report said Indian tier-1 companies had won more orders than global majors in the fourth quarter.

"The law clearly states that deportation made on the strength of an Interpol notice has to be made to the country of origin of the person apprehended. In this case, it's Antigua, where he is contesting both his extradition and cancellation of citizenship. So, deportation won't be easy," said a senior official privy to the developments.

If the deportation comes through, it could be done either directly by the Dominican government or a team could go there to fetch him, the official added.

BPCL Plans ₹12k-cr Capex for FY22

The company invested ₹1,000 crore on capex in 2021-22. BPCL management also said that it has no plans to sell its stakes in Indraprastha Gas (IGL) or Petronas LNG, both listed entities, even as the state-run oil marketing major goes for privatisation.

Cong writes to Delhi top cop over 'illegal enquiry' in toolkit case

NEW DELHI: Senior Congress leader Rajeev Gowda on Thursday wrote a letter to the Delhi police commissioner alleging that without registering an FIR, the police were conducting an "illegal preliminary enquiry" on his May 18 complaint related to the "sharing and uploading of a fake toolkit" by senior Bharatiya Janata Party leaders on social media.

Gowda, chairperson of the Research Department of the All India Congress Committee (AICC), also shared a copy of the letter on Twitter, in which he has accused Delhi police of not registering a First Information Report (FIR) and allegedly protecting the BJP leaders.

In the letter, signed by Gowda and another Congress leader, Rohan Gupta, chairman of the party's social media department, the two have asked Delhi police commissioner SN Shrivastava to transfer their May 18 complaint to the Chhattisgarh police because police there have already registered an FIR and are probing the case. The two leaders had filed a similar complaint against BJP leader Sambit Patra over his alleged role in the Chhattisgarh police too on May 18.

The BJP has said that the documents posted by BJP leader Sambit Patra were part of a

"toolkit" made to defame Prime Minister Narendra Modi and build a biased narrative over Covid-19 management and the Central Vista project.

Delhi police on May 22 asked the two Congress leaders to join the investigation as they started a preliminary enquiry into the allegations. The two were sent notices on May 21, the same day Twitter's (India) managing director Manish Maheshwari was sent a notice, asking him for his participation in the investigation through his physical presence at the special cell's Lodhi Colony office on May 22. However, none of the three joined the letter on Twitter, which has been accused Delhi police of not registering a First Information Report (FIR) and allegedly protecting the BJP leaders.

While two of them are admitted in a state-run hospital, two went back home after the court put them under house arrest on May 21. The bench on Thursday, however, questioned the Central Bureau of Investigation if a judicial order can be disregarded on the basis of public perception.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta appearing for the agency sought that the entire proceedings that took place at a special CBI court on May 17 be declared as void and non-est. The court, however, said that if there is nothing on record to show that the special CBI court was influenced, then how could the bench look into other factors.

TMC MP and advocate Kalyan Banerjee appearing on behalf of Subrata Mukherjee, one of the accused, told the court that when a recall application on a stay order is filed it must be heard within two weeks. The recall petition was filed on May 19. The CBI on May 17 arrested the leaders. On May 21, however, the HC put them under house arrest.

Monsoon to arrive early in Kerala: IMD

NEW DELHI: Conditions are favourable for the onset of monsoon in Kerala around May 31, a day ahead of its usual date, India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Thursday. IMD scientists said the very severe Cyclonic Yaas, which ravaged Odisha and West Bengal coasts on Wednesday, helped strengthen monsoon winds.

Normally, monsoon arrives in Kerala around June 1 and covers the rest of India by mid-July. Sunitha Devi, who is in charge of cyclones at IMD, said there is no likelihood of a low-pressure area developing immediately. "Cyclonic Yaas has weakened. Now monsoon will gradually

pick up," she said. Mahesh Palawat, vice president, Skymet Weather, said Cyclonic Yaas helped pull the monsoon current ahead in the Arabian Sea. "There was heavy to very heavy rain reported in

Sea has strengthened because of which heavy rain was reported over Kerala. "But that is not monsoon rain. We are expecting monsoon to arrive on May 31."

On May 14, IMD said monsoon is likely to arrive over Kerala on May 31 a day ahead of its normal arrival date of June 1, with a possible error margin of plus/minus four days. The monsoon season is crucial for summer crops and brings about 70% of India's annual rainfall. It is critical to the country's agriculture, which is one of the mainstays of its economy. The monsoon impacts inflation, jobs, and industrial demand. Good farm output keeps a lid on food inflation. Ample harvests raise rural incomes and help inject demand into the economy.

In India, there's always thirst for beer

More brands, homegrown as well as international, are making a beeline for the country

This has been the summer of beer, if not for the second covid-19 wave tearing through India. Scottish giant Brewdog opened its first brewpub in Mumbai in February. Ironhill soon followed with the world's largest microbrewery in Bengaluru, and as the now-suspended IPL got underway, M.S. Dhoni announced his association with a new beer brand, Coper 7, named for his famous helicopter shot and his jersey number 7.

India, it seems, can't have too much beer—whether it's the good, old bottled stuff brought from the corner store or the more upscale craft beer that's sold as an entire experience.

And there's always room for more, as United Breweries (UBL) notes in its 2019-20 annual report released in June. "Beer industry has registered robust

growth in the last one and a half decades. From a total industry consumption of about 100 million cases in 2005, the consumption crossed 300 million cases in 2019," states the report from market leader UBL, which counts Kingfisher, Heineken and Amstel Beer in its portfolio. "Barring the covid-19 impact—both in terms of revenues and sales volume, which may last during the current year—the market is expected to grow."

"The right target audience is here," says Karan Jain, co-CEO, Brewdog India (Ace Aloha Group) of the company's India plans. The pub chain has "plans to open 10 by December, and increase our footprint to 100 over the next five-six years."

In Bengaluru, Pawan Kumar, the bar manager of Ironhill, says they had repeat customers during the month they were open, proving there's always a thirst for beer. Ironhill, which opened on 27 March and is spread over two acres of an old garment factory, is currently closed owing to the lockdown. "Our outlet is located in Marollihalli and sees a mixed crowd. The only other option similar to ours was Byg Brewski but its location means it primarily caters to the IT crowd," Kumar adds.

Around the time craft breweries started making their mark in India, a decade ago, the food and beverage industry was seeing a few other vital changes. Going out for coffee had started gaining acceptance, with brands like Café Coffee Day and Barista, and international firms suddenly

woke up to India's younger demographic. "Any boardroom meeting that includes India as a market will turn heads because of our population. That's what led to many international beer brands to look at India while craft beer was taking off," says Abhishek Chinchalkar, co-founder and head brewer of Bombay Duck Brewing. Jain of Brewdog, which is the latest international entrant, says, "India has seen a huge increase in craft beer sales in recent

years. Consumers' changing tastes and willingness to experiment has allowed them to appreciate craft beer versus mass produced bottled commercial beer. At the same time, the craft beer industry has restricted itself to a few styles, staying away from innovation in style, taste and aroma profiles. We intend to disrupt this market and fill this gap by having 20-24 beers on tap wherever we go." Chinchalkar says beer makers had it

easy as it was a familiar drink. "The wine industry had to fight, explain grapes and wine styles, as we're not a wine-drinking nation. On the other hand, everybody has had beer while growing up so it was easier for us to experiment in the craft space."

"With our warm climate, chilled beer is the perfect afternoon or evening drink," says Saumya Khona, co-founder of Tapped Flight, a monthly beer subscription and delivery service that covers Mumbai and Pune.

To make a craft brewery work, says Nayan Shah of Drifters Breweries, a retail presence is paramount. "Every craft brewery must have a retail outlet to connect and create memories for the customer. It helps in expansion. Since opening our growler stations in Mumbai suburbs like Thane, Andheri and Powai, apart from Bandra, we've seen consumption go up four-five times."

One of the challenges to entering new markets as a craft brand are the laws regarding alcohol sales in India, with each state having different rules and regulations. "In India, bureaucracy restricts our growth," Shah says.

Echoing the thought, Aditya Ishan Varshnei, co-founder and CEO of Latambarc Brewers that makes Moka Di Beers in Goa, gives the example of taxation. "Beers should be taxed on ABV (alcohol by volume) and not overall volume. Beers and wines are different from high ABV spirits and taxing them in the same cate-

gory as gin, vodka or whisky needs to change." With such changes, "we can grow exponentially over the next 10 years," Varshnei says.

Beer has a separate fanbase when it comes to spirits. "Beer remains versatile in terms of age and lends itself easily to day drinks, post-work, mid-week drink," says Bhakti Mehta, co-founder of Tapped Flight.

Craft beer, however, will find it hard to scale up to the level of commercial beers because of the differences in production, Shah of Drifters Breweries says. "You need to find your niche and settle there if you're a craft brand."

Varshnei believes craft beers will never find croses of consumers. "We should be happy with a couple of hundred thousand people. If your beers are good and of high quality, you will find that audience."

Beer comprises 12% of the total alcohol consumed in India, the UBL report notes, and adds that "while the alcohol beverages industry in India has been dominated by spirits, beer remains the preferred alcoholic beverage for young Indians." Despite this, craft beer makers believe there's scope for greater growth.

"The beer consumption in India is just 1.2 litres per person per year, as compared with China (32 litres) or Vietnam (20 litres) or the US (35 litres)," says Jain. "This is just the beginning. India has a huge, young demographic looking for a better product as well as experience."

Rolls-Royce to go electric with Silent Shadow

The 116-year-old luxury carmaker is also giving clients a chance to commission cars to specifications

Luxury carmaker Rolls-Royce has confirmed that it is working on an all-new vehicle, Silent Shadow, as the iconic British brand prepares to offer a fully electric car to its ultra-wealthy clientele this decade. The BMW AG division last year filed a trademark with the German patent office for the name Silent Shadow, a nod to the Silver Shadow model sold from 1965 to 1980. Rolls-Royce CEO Torsten Mueller-Oetwoes has not mentioned a potential launch date. "That is still a secret," he said. "But it will of course obviously be a brand-new Rolls-Royce, rest assured."

Regulation is catching up with super-luxury carmakers worldwide. U.K., for instance, is planning to ban the sale of combustion engine vehicles. While some of the cachet of a Ferrari derives from its growling engine, Mueller-Oetwoes said the quieter tones of Rolls-Royce couple well with battery power. "Electrification fits perfectly to Rolls-Royce—it's torque-y, it's super-silent," he said. "We are not known for roar-y, loud engines and exhaust noises, and that's a big benefit."

While the pandemic suppressed vehicle demand in many regions, Rolls-Royce's production run is booked out for the year. Orders started to rise strongly from the fourth quarter of last year as the pandemic unleashed a free-spending attitude, Mueller-Oetwoes said of the company's clients. "Many have witnessed how quickly life can end, and so it's good to enjoy life today and not to postpone it," he said.

The 116-year-old luxury brand is working to balance out increasingly high sales volumes by indulging its clients' penchant for rarity and exclusivity. He also announced Rolls-Royce Coachbuild, a new programme that will allow its most elite customers to commission a car of their own. "We have seen quite a lot of clients approaching us asking if they could do something [unique]," he said. "Coachbuild is in trust form itself; the client comes, tells us what kind of body he would like to see, and we do it. That is what is happening here."

They have made three individual cars, in a style they are now calling the Rolls-Royce Boat Tail. Each has been custom-built as an open-air four-seater with a rear portion designed to evoke the deck of a J Class yacht—a single-masted racing boat like those used in the Americas Cup. Each car is unique in coloration, trimlines, interior flourishes and specific requests, while other basic details may be familiar to those who already own bespoke Rolls-Royce coaches: a refrigerator to hold champagne bottles cooled to precisely six degrees Celsius, for example, and an aluminum-and-leather glove box sized to hold a special pen.

Meanwhile, Ferrari, which is preparing to unveil its first all-electric model in 2025, has said that sustainable mobility has become central to its philosophy. The commitment puts Ferrari ahead of Lamborghini, one of its main rivals, on the road to electrification, as the Volkswagen-owned supercar brand is not planning to launch a fully electric model until the second half of the decade.

2DG is only A Wild Goose Chase

Ggn Docs Prescribe Drug Developed By DRDO, But Not Available In Market Yet

Gurgaon: At least half a dozen instances have been reported in Gurgaon of doctors prescribing 2DG (2-deoxy-D-glucose), the drug developed by DRDO in collaboration with pharmaceutical company Dr Reddy's Laboratories and approved for emergency use, to Covid patients and asking their family members to procure it, even though it is not yet available in the market.

The prescriptions have sent family members of patients on futile hunts for the drug, running from one pharmacy to another, and also to government offices. "I have no clue how we can get this drug when it is not available in the market yet," said Koushal Kumar, whose father (57) is an ventilator support. "It is an ventilator support," he was told by the doctor. It is very important that we procure the drug. But no one is explaining how I have to go out to the district administration.

A 52-year-old man who

but haven't got any help so far," he added.

The son of a 48-year-old man admitted to a private hospital near Hush City Centre has a similar experience and told TOI. "The doctor prescribed the drug on May 25 and it had dropped below 50, we had to admit him to hospital. But the doctor asked me to get the new drug. When I inquired

District drug controller Anand Chopra said the drug is expected to be in the market after the second week of June. "We do not have the drug at present. According to the manufacturer, it will be available in the mar-

ket after the second week of June," said Chauhan.

2DG, which has been granted emergency use approval as an adjunct therapy for moderate to severe Covid patients, is an anti-viral that comes in powder form in sachets and can be taken af-

ter it is dissolved in water. It accumulates in virus-infected cells and prevents virus growth by stopping viral synthesis and energy production. It is not yet commercially available. Dr Reddy's had earlier announced that commercial launch and supply of the drug to hospitals was expected to begin in mid-June.

Gang duping Covid patients busted

New Delhi: With the arrest of a postman from Alwar in Rajasthan, cops have stumbled upon a syndicate, which was operating online accounts using half-baked documents and receiving debit cards on fictitious addresses. These accounts were then used to receive money siphoned from Covid patients.

According to joint commissioner (CRIME) Subhash Singh, the teams were tracking a gang that had duped a woman of Rs 48,000 on the pretext of providing oxygen cylinders. The payment was made through Google Pay.

The cops analysed several accounts in which the money was received by crooks and

found that they all had "Kala Khan, Hosing Board, Alwar" address without any house number and other details. The cops then stumbled upon the postman, Shival Sharma, who was helping the accused receive the sums. He used to charge Rs 200 per ATM card for delivery.

In another operation, 84kgs of used surgical gloves were seized from a warehouse in southwest Delhi's Dabri. A gang was repacking and selling the gloves. "SFO Dabri Surinder Sandhu's team had received information that used gloves were being repacked after normal washing procedure, after which a raid was planned," the DCP said. The accused were identified as Manish Kumar Arun Shrivastava and Dinesh Rajput.

Take action on PIL claiming poor state of quarantine centre: HC

Delhi High Court on Thursday directed Delhi government to treat as a representation a PIL claiming that the quarantine centre at Sultanpuri was "unhygienic", "uninhabitable" and lacked medical professionals to monitor them, and ordered it to take "immediate" action on the concerns raised in the plea. A bench of Chief Justice D N Patel and Justice Jyoti Singh asked the government to take immediate action. With the direction, the court disposed of the petition by a JNU student, who claimed that she had tested Covid positive while staying on the wanky campus, and since there was no quarantine facility there, she was transferred to the Sultanpuri Isolation Centre. She added that her "utter shock" the quarantine centre was unhygienic and no facilities were given to the patients. During her four-day stay, she had found that "patients were suffering severely not only on account of their illness, but also due to the negligence of the authorities in providing them with basic facilities like sanitation, food, medicines, regular doctor visits, proper monitoring of oxygen, etc". She had also alleged that "not a single person visits these wards, be it a doctor or nurse". She had sought appointment of a court commissioner to visit the facility and directions to Delhi government "to follow the recommendation issued by WHO and the guidelines issued by NCCG for implementing quarantine".

PIL in HC seeks daily update on patients' health

Family members or attendants of Covid-19 patients should be kept updated about their condition and treatment being provided, a PIL has sought in Delhi High Court, which on Thursday asked for the Centre and Delhi government's stand on the issue. A bench of Chief Justice D N Patel and Justice Jyoti Singh issued notice seeking their response to the plea by an NGO that contended, presently the families only received news about the death of a patient or demand for deposit of the hospital charges. It added that providing daily updates would "develop confidence and trust in the system of governance". The NGO, Manav Awaaj Trust, has sought a direction to Delhi government "to frame a policy and/or guideline for communication of status report" every 24 hours to family or attendants of the patients about their condition, treatment, provided and details of the attending doctors.

3 crematoria to come up on DDA land

New Delhi: Delhi Development Authority (DDA) has given its approval for setting up new CNG/electric crematoria at three sites in south Delhi abutting Gurgaon. The sites will come up at Bantoli Road, Aya Nagar and Ghiorani. Rear row CNG-based cremation sites had already been added to the city during the pandemic, with two sites each under South and East Delhi Municipal Corporations.

The municipal health officer from public health department had earlier written to DDA for allocation of land at three village sites in November 2020 to set up CNG/electric crematoria. DDA has now written to request department to hand over the land parcels. It added that the land for the three sites had not been handed over to DDA

by the respective revenue department after urbanisation yet.

Vel Pal, the area collector, said these three sites were located on gram sabha land, and each had just a couple of cremation platforms. "As the number of deaths increased during pandemic, people had to wait 5-6 hours for their turn. Therefore, I pushed the demand to set up CNG crematoria at these locations," he added.

Man posts video of pet flying with balloons, arrested

New Delhi: A YouTube, who tied helium-filled balloons to his pet dog and tried to make it "fly" was arrested in the city. Gaurav Sharma (32), who has over four million subscribers on YouTube, had shot a video of the act and uploaded it on his channel on May 21 to gain likes and views. However, the video was criticised by viewers, following which he reportedly "deleted" it and uploaded a clarification elaborating on the safety measures he took while trying to make his dog, Dollar, fly.

The video showed Sharma standing atop a car with his Pomeranian and letting it go. The dog, having over a dozen balloons tied to it, flew in the air and reached second floor of an adjacent building. It was the only air for five seconds.

The incident was brought to the notice of People for Animals NGO, which filed a complaint against Sharma at Malviya Nagar police station. DCP (South Area) Thakur said, "We received a complaint from PFA alleging that Sharma had risked his dog's life and registered an FIR under sections of Disaster Management Act and Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act. Sharma, a resident of Panchsheel Vihar in Malviya Nagar, was arrested. He was, however, released on bail later. During questioning, he told the cops that he made it as a gesture of fun for his channel.

In another incident, two men were apprehended for beating a stray dog to death in Okhla, DCP R P Meena said. One of the accused is a minor, while the other was identified as Jatinder. "A video was going viral on social media on Thursday in which two boys were seen beating a street dog with sticks. Subsequently, a complaint was received from People for Animals and an FIR registered," DCP Meena said. The accused were identified based on local intelligence and nabbed.

BARGE TRAGEDY

Ministry team video records chief engineer's statement

Shaikh in his statement said barge master and 'companies' are responsible for mishap

A team from the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas recorded the statement of the chief engineer of barge Papaa (P-305) which capsized and sank 70 km off the Mumbai coast due to cyclone Taufat on May 17.

The statement of chief engineer Mustafaizur Rehman Shaikh (48) has been video recorded by the team which visited him on Tuesday at Apollo hospital in Andhera, where he is recuperating. According to sources, Shaikh in his statement said that the barge master and companies are responsible for the mishap as they were not in the favour of warning the barge despite the cyclone warning. He also alleged that the barge master was adamant and did not take a timely decision, and that instead of



thinking about the safety of personnel on board, financial considerations took precedence. They miscalculated and thought moving 200 meters away would be enough, while the other vessels there were moving to safer locations, he said in his statement. The team will also speak to other survivors and the Navy rescue team and will prepare a report after speaking to experts. The report will be submitted to DG Shipping which will also recreate the mishap using a

simulator before deciding the course of action. The Ministry has already set up a High-Level Committee two days after the incident to enquire into the sequence of events. While the DG Shipping has formed two investigation teams, a nautical advisor will investigate the probe while the other team will make a note so that such mishap can be averted in future. Based on Shaikh's statement the Yellow Gate police had registered an offence of culpable homicide not

amounting to murder against the barge captain Rakesh Ballav and others. The police have so far recorded statements of over 100 rescued crew members, they have also issued summons to the barge company and its charterer agency. The police however refused to divulge the names of the companies involved which have been issued summons.

The tragedy claimed the lives of 75 people on board while 166 were rescued by the Navy. The Mumbai police have so far identified and handed over 53 bodies of the crew members and are taking DNA samples from the unidentified bodies. The DNA samples will be matched with their family members for identification. Two of the eight bodies which washed ashore at Gujarat coast have been identified and handed over to their kin.

Disabled above 45 yrs can get vax at any centre in NMMC

The decision comes after people highlight difficulties faced by them

Disabled persons above 45 years of age can visit any vaccination centre of Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) and take vaccination without waiting in the queue. NMMC chief Abhijit Bangar took the decision following demand from a section of society.



While the necessary preparations are being taken by NMMC to deal with the possible third wave of Covid-19, the target is to inoculate at least the first dose to all citizens above the age of 45 by July 31. Civic chief Bangar is handling the vaccination programme in the city himself.

"In view of the difficulties faced by the disabled persons who could not go to the vaccination centre and queue for to be taken number due to physical difficulties, the municipal commissioner Abhijit Bangar

has issued an order to vaccinate the disabled persons directly without queuing at any vaccination centre of the corporation," said a senior official from the civic health department. The officer that this will make it easier for people with disabilities over the age of 45 to get vaccinated easily. Even the Parel Municipal Corporation (PMC) had taken a similar step last week and allotted one hour in the evening for disabled persons for vaccination. As per the PMC decision, a disabled person can visit between 4 and 5 pm at the allotted centre and vaccine without waiting in the queue.

While the necessary preparations are being taken by NMMC to deal with the possible third wave of Covid-19, the target is to inoculate at least the first dose to all citizens

above the age of 45 by July 31. Civic chief Bangar is handling the vaccination programme in the city himself. Though the supply of Covid vaccine is relatively low at present, the corporation has issued a global tender for the purchase of the Covid-19 vaccine and the follow-up is ongoing. In doing so, the daily planning of vaccination is being closely monitored and care is being taken to ensure that the vaccinations will be available to the citizens of all the departments in the municipal area at their nearest centre. In the NMMC area, so far, 2,70,298 citizens have been vaccinated out of which 65,384 citizens have also taken a second dose of the Covid vaccine. Thus, a total of 3.65 lakh vaccines have been given by NMMC.

Teen sustains burns after electrocution during repair works

A 17-year-old youth sustained 65 percent burns, while another man was injured after they were electrocuted due to contact with a high voltage wire in Santa Nagar on Wednesday.

Police have arrested the contractor and booked him under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and Juvenile Justice Act for endangering their lives. According to police sources, the incident occurred in Bihar Tekdi at Poisar area in Kandivali (E), at a society where a contractor had appointed five men, including a minor boy aged 17 years, to do the repair work of the ground-plus-one structure. Police said that the victim was working on the terrace, when he accidentally came in contact with a high voltage electrical wire that electrocuted him at the spot, and injured another in the process.

Both injured were immediately rushed to the civil-run Shantabai Hospital, where the teen was shifted to Sion Hospital due to the severe burn injuries and the other man was treated for his minor burn injuries.

Create awareness against spitting in public places: HC to state authorities

The Bombay High bench of Justices Amjad Sayed and Girish Kulkarni on Thursday ordered the BMC as well as the Maharashtra government to create a large-scale awareness against spitting in public. The HC said citizens must be told that they run a risk of getting infected and even spreading the diseases, by spitting.

The HC was hearing a plea filed by Amrin Wandrewala highlighting the nuisance of spitting in public. She told the bench that the BMC as well as the state didn't accept her suggestions against spitting in public.

"The authorities have refused to accept my suggestion to make citizens do community service, which enjoins lowering of an individual's ego. This would prove to be deterrent," she told the judges.

The bench noted the submission and said that spitting continues to be an issue. "We believe the authorities must spread aware-



ness against spitting. Tell the citizens that they run a risk of getting infected and also spreading the virus or any other disease by spitting," the bench said.

Meanwhile, Pune civic body told the judges that it charges over Rs 1000 as a fine to citizens and have collected half a crore from fines.

At this, the bench asked for details on amount collected from fines. Justice Kulkarni further said that it was good that the BEST's double-decker buses have stopped from plying on the roads. "I say so because the moment your car is aside the bus, you receive a huge rainfall," Justice Kulkarni said, adding that Justice Sayed has expressed the need wherein someone spat on his cell phone.

Boy orders jacket online, duped of ₹1L

Cyber fraudsters continue to dupe people by luring them into different traps, irrespective of the fact that the victim is a senior citizen or a minor. Recently, a 14-year-old boy who was using his mother's mobile phone to attend online lectures, fell prey to cyber con and ended up losing Rs 1 lakh to the fraud. On Wednesday, the RAK Marg Police registered an offence based on a written complaint filed by the teen's mother.

The teen, a resident of Sewri, had been using his mother's mobile phone to attend online lectures since last year; the same phone number is also attached to his mother's e-wallet, said police. As the schools and colleges are shut due to Covid-19, teenagers like him are forced to rely on mobile phones for studies as well as for entertainment. Her nightman boy's father repairs TV while his mother is a housewife, said police.

Recently the teenager had ordered a jacket worth Rs 261 from a shopping portal and had paid the money online. Two days later when the jacket was not delivered, the teen contacted the number given on the website.

A person, who claimed to be a marketing manager of the portal answered his call



and told him that due to a lockdown his order has been cancelled. He asked the teen to reorder and asked him to share the OTP (one time password) received on his phone. The fraudsters already have his card details including card number and CVV (Card Verification Value) number as the teen paid online while ordering a jacket.

Unaware of the con the teenager continued to share OTPs with the 'representative', said police. The incident came to light when the boy narrated the incident to his mother who immediately rushed to the bank sensing danger. Her nightman came true when she updated her passbook and realised that Rs 1.06 lakh had been withdrawn in a series of five transactions.

"We have registered an offence of cheating under the section 60C (identity theft) and 60D (cheating by person using computer resources) of the Information Technology act. And our investigation is underway, said police.
